-all pre-order plants are 5.00, either a young perennial dug from my holding beds or a landscape plug, well-rooted, and ready to plant. Provided in a plastic bag with a wooden i.d. label.

### **ANSWERS TO FAQ**

-I grow from seed collected in Maine and I propagate from cuttings, division, and seed collected from my own stock. I also purchase seed from various seed houses. Currently I also purchase landscape plugs from wholesale nurseries that I trust (more info below). This is to help me increase stock and get these plants to gardeners asap. If you need a large quantity of a sedge or ground cover, I can help source these for you.

-The wholesale nurseries I deal with are in Maine, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Michigan, and Wisconsin. I purchase seeds, plugs, small plants, roots, or whips and grow them on. None of the growers I work with use neonicotinoids. Some of them use Integrated Pest Management (IPM), and some of them are certified organic. Many, but not all, of their plants are seed grown. I am not certified organic but follow organic practices. If you are interested in plants *only grown from seed collected in Maine*, I am happy to connect you with other nurseries who specialize in this. The Wild Seed Project is also an excellent resource.

-Seed houses specializing in native seed obtain their seed from many eco-regions. Having seed from your eco-region is good, and I am happy to discuss the reasons why. It is more or less critical depending on your goals and depending on the species in question. I am interested in this, but I do not want it to stop gardeners from planting more native plants as soon as possible.

-Native plants are tough, but do the best in appropriate growing conditions. I will eventually have more information regarding this in printed form. I am always happy to discuss your specific type of soil and light conditions and help select plants for them. You do not need to spend a lot of money and time "fixing" your soil. You just need the right plants.
